Non-Members

Offenses in a Meeting

Progressive Discipline

If a non-member that has requested or been invited to speak in a meeting conducts themselves in a manner deemed by the assembly as rude, hostile, or offensive, the President may:

1. Warn them of their behavior and request that they conduct themselves appropriately for the remainder of the meeting;
2. Ask them to remove themselves from the meeting;
3. Temporarily suspend future requests from and/or invitations to the individual and/or their association to come before the assembly.
4. Indefinitely ban any future requests from and/or invitations to the individual and/or their association to come before the assembly.

Appeals Process

For Non-Members

ONLY MEMBERS MAY APPEAL FOR NON-MEMBERS. Appeals may only be made to convert an indefinite ban to a suspension period for a non-member(s) and/or their association.

1. The Hui must receive seven (7) formal appeals submitted by seven (7) members, explaining why they feel the non-member, or another representative of that association, should be allowed to come before the assembly again.
2. The Hui will then invite the non-member and/or their association to submit a formal apology.
3. The formal apology shall be read by the President at the next Regular Meeting of the Executive Board.

4. The President shall then move to repeal the ban or not.
5. The motion shall be adopted by a majority vote of the Executive Board Members in attendance, where a quorum is present.
6. An official letter from the Hui shall be emailed/mailed to the non-member and/or their association, detailing:
 - A. Suspension Period Terms - A specific date of when the non-member and/or their association may begin to request the chance to come before the assembly again.
 - B. Reaffirmation of the Ban - An explanation of why the ban will remain and when another appeal for the non-member and/or their association may be submitted.
